# **COVID-19 Resident Screening Tool**

- Monitoring required minimum **twice daily** (VS and SpO<sub>2</sub>) for all residents who have been exposed and are being monitored for symptoms as well as those who have tested positive. Indicate new or worsening symptom(s) by using the provided **code** in boxes. Flag abnormal findings by circling in red ink or highlighting.
- Nurses will initial at the bottom of each page after assessment is completed and document in Interdisciplinary Progress Notes as required.
- Refer to Infection Control Guidelines and report symptoms to Charge Nurse/Provider of care. Update COVID outbreak line list.

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## **COVID-19 Resident Screening Tool**

### **Instructions for Use:**

Recommended use:

- Actively monitoring and screening residents for COVID symptoms in the following situation:
  - Residents are confirmed COVID-19 positive and remain asymptomatic; or
  - Residents who have been exposed to a COVID-19 positive person and remain asymptomatic; or
  - Any asymptomatic resident actively being monitored for COVID-19 symptoms regardless of exposure risk

Tool can be used for both communication and documentation as a permanent part of the resident's health record.

If resident develops symptoms, more frequent monitoring (i.e. every shift) will be required. In addition to ongoing monitoring of COVID symptoms using this tool, initiate NEWS2 Vital Sign Record:

National Early Warning Score (NEWS2) Vital Sign Record

Recommended use for:

- Residents who have developed COVID-19 symptoms
- · Residents who require closer monitoring due to change in condition

Tool supports clinical judgement on determining immediate next steps if resident's condition changes.

Refer to the NEWS Infographic to help educate nurses on the tool.

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
