Non-Ambulatory Patient Discharge Following Successful Recovery

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Preamble

- Use this checklist to discharge a non-ambulatory patient following successful recovery
- For the purposes of this checklist, a non-ambulatory patient is defined as a person who is unable to walk independently (with or without an assistive device) and/or is deemed unsafe to shower alone
- Confirm with the Site Medical Director and Infection Prevention & Control the patient has been deemed recovered
- Determine whether the patient is to be discharged home or transferred to another facility/ward
- Verify transport arrangements are in place and if applicable, receiving facility/ward is aware of transfer.
 Consider alternate room or location for patient to wait after discharge from unit in the event that there is a time delay with transport services
- Review this checklist and consider, in advance, all additional staff required to carry out the discharge process, including number of Primary healthcare workers+ (HCWs) required to safely bathe, roll, and transfer the patient
 - Per OESH guidance, two healthcare workers are required for any transfer less than or equal to 45 kg/100 lbs. For every 45 kg/100 lbs added patient weight, an additional healthcare worker is required
 - Two Primary+ HCWs working together will be referred to as a set
 - At a minimum, two sets of Primary HCWs+ are recommended. The first set of Primary HCWs+ will be responsible for bathing and preparing the patient to exit the patient room. The second set of Primary HCWs+ will transport the patient to a clean room for a second bath before transporting off the unit
 - Note: the second set of Primary HCWs+ may return to their pre-JK3 location after assisting with this protocol, as the patient is already recovered, and would have had an initial bath
- Ensure Waste Management processes are completed so the discharge process can begin with empty blue drums in patient room and anteroom: <u>Waste Removal BLUE DRUM</u>; <u>Waste Removal ANTEROOM</u>
- Preview checklist, ensure staff are aware of roles and are ready to begin the discharge process
- Arrange to collect shower stretcher from unit RR5 prior to beginning checklist
- Gather necessary equipment and supplies as listed below
- Anteroom door is the door between the hallway and anteroom
- Patient room door is the door between the anteroom and patient room
- Review glove hygiene process:
 - Immerse gloved hands into basin and rub together in IP&C approved disinfectant without splashing
 - Pat gloves dry with IP&C approved disinfectant wipe(s)
- If the Primary+ has soiled scrubs, proceed to the Soiled Scrubs Checklist as determined by the Monitor.



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The Shower Room will be set up to provide patient with a second bath with Chlorhexidine soap (CHG)
prior to exiting the unit. This room will require the following items in addition to anything else the team
may consider/anticipate

Supplies:

- Shower Room Anteroom:
 - o Blue drum set up
 - Table for glove hygiene
 - o 2 basins

Note: disinfectant mats not required for this clean anteroom set up

- Shower Room for CHG bath Supplies:
 - o Blue drum set up
 - Stretcher with clean sheets and a clean blanket (or wheelchair if patient can tolerate)
 - Clean sliders and extension straps
 - o Bathing supplies wash cloths, towels, CHG soap, shampoo
 - Patient's clean clothing
 - IP&C approved disinfectant solution and disinfectant wipes
 - Glove hygiene station
 - Absorbent pads
 - Mop supplies

Note: Leave door to room in hold open position

- Patient Room Clean Bathing Kit Supplies:
 - Bath in a Bag products to bathe patient and shampoo hair
 - Washcloths (4)
 - o Towels (4)
 - Disposable gown
 - Two sets of clean linen
 - Clean sliders (2)
 - Slider extension straps (2)
 - Plastic bag to carry supplies
- Chlorhexidine gluconate Bathing Kit Supplies:
 - Chlorhexidine gluconate (CHG) soap
 - Regular shampoo
 - Washcloths (4)
 - o Towels (4)
 - o Patient's own clean clothes or clean hospital gown (if transferring to another unit)
 - Clean transport equipment determine what is appropriate for patient's mobility status for transfer to shower room and post shower (e.g., shower stretcher, commode, wheelchair)
 - Clean sliders (2)
 - Slider extension straps (2)



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PREPARATION:

EvS Monitor ∇ to confirm with EvS Aide♦ that patient room and anteroom will be cleaned as per HCPU Occupied Isolation Room Cleaning by Environmental Services checklist

NOTE: Prior to exiting patient room, advise EvS Aide♦ to leave mop set up in patient room as follows for Primary+ (required for Step 1):

- Place absorbent pad on floor against wall near observation window
- Saturate absorbent pad with disinfectant solution
- Apply clean disinfectant-soaked microfiber to mop
- Place mop on top of absorbent pad and lean against wall

When all cleaning is complete, doff per Doffing Primary PPE checklist and exit

When patient exits Shower Room, ensure a Clean Healthcare Worker is available to receive patient in hallway on stretcher.

	Shampoo patient's hair with regular shampoo and use shower wand to rinse

Apply CHG soap from patient's neck to feet, taking care not to apply	CHG soap must dwell on skin
CHG soap directly to head, face or genitals	for 5 minutes before rinsing off
Lay towel over top of patient	For warmth and dignity
Monitor 3 φ: Set timer for 5 minutes	
When 5 minutes is up, discard towel in blue drum and thoroughly rinse CHG soap off patient with shower wand	
Let water drain out of shower stretcher	
Dry patient and shower stretcher with towels	
Discard towels and wash cloths in blue drum	
Perform glove hygiene	
Cover patient with clean towel or blanket	
Place clean sliders under patient. May need extension straps for sliders	
Transfer patient to clean stretcher, using sliders	Consideration to use wheelchair instead of stretcher if patient can tolerate
Assist patient to don clean personal clothing	
Disinfect sides of stretcher with disinfectant wipes; discard wipes • Wait 1-minute wet contact time	
Perform glove hygiene	
Primary 3+: Use prepared mop set up to mop floor of room, focusing on pathway from stretcher to door	
Primary 4+: Open door in hold open position	
Primary 3+ and 4+: Move patient on clean stretcher into anteroom	
Monitor 3 φ: Open anteroom door	
Clean Health Care Worker (HCW) in hallway to receive patient on stretcher	No PPE required for the HCW in hallway
Primary 3+ and 4+: Return into room and wait for Assistant 1Ω to enter anteroom to doff one at a time per <u>Doffing Primary PPE</u> <u>Checklist</u>	

8. Clean HCW in Hallway
Receive patient in the hall
Transport patient on stretcher (or wheelchair) to unit's exit doors where patient will be received by transport staff
Once the patient has exited unit: Return stretcher or wheelchair to the Shower Room to ensure inclusion in the discharge cleaning/disinfection by Environmental Services
