

Disclosure of Patient Safety Events

There is an obligation from the healthcare team or organization to communicate patient safety events to patients and families.



Disclosure occurs when there has been any harm, or there is risk of future harm, related to a patient safety event.

Initial Disclosure

Use clear terms & straightforward words.
Clarify & answer questions

Review Event

Ongoing Contact

Final Disclosure

Share findings and recommendations with patient & family

How to Disclose...

Be Honest & Sincere

Privacy, body language, eye contact

Setting the agenda, "I'd like to talk to you about..." Include apology

Listen to patient & family, offer to explain

Address & acknowledge emotions
