| Fever without focus | | Adults: Routine Practices Pediatric: Contact Precautions Contact Precautions Droplet Precautions or Agmy annument of Agmy | If findings suggest a specific transmissible infection, take precautions for that infection pending diagnosis | Adults: Any Paediatric: Single room |
| Gastroenteritis Diarrhea and/or vomiting | | Routine Practices Children & Adults: Contact Precautions (if incontinent or have inadequate hygiene) Contact Precautions Droplet Precautions for AGMPs until am/pm on am/pm on date | Contact Precautions for patients if incontinent (regardless if stool can be contained) or patients with inadequate hygiene | Adults and Paediatric: Any If incontinent or have inadequate hygiene: Single room |
| Rash compatible with scabies | Sarcoptes scabiei | Contact Precautions Droplet Precautions Airborne Precautions for AGMPs until am/pm on date | | Single room |
| Rash (maculopapular) with fever and one of coryza, conjunctivitis or cough | Measles | Contact Precautions Droplet Precautions Airborne Precautions for AGMPs until am/pm on date | If Measles is suspected, only immune HCWs, caregivers and visitors should enter the room. N95 respirator required for non-immune persons who must enter | AllR* Single room, door closed |
| Rash (petechial/ purpuric) with fever | Meningitis | Contact Precautions Precautions Droplet Precautions Airborne Precautions for AGMPs until am/pm on date | If meningitis <u>Droplet/Contact</u> <u>Precautions</u> for children less than 5 years old When type of meningitis (virus or Neisseria meningitidis or other bacteria), is identified refer to <u>Microorganism</u> , <u>Infectious Disease</u> <u>Table</u> or <u>Meningitis Protocol</u> for more information. | Single room preferred; at least 2 meters apart from other bed spaces if multi-bed room |
| Rash (vesicular) with fever | Varicella | Contact Precautions Droplet Precautions Airborne Precautions for AGMPs until am/pm on date | If Varicella HCWs, roommates and caregivers should be immune to chickenpox. People with known immunity do not need an N95 respirator to enter the room | AIIR* Single room, door closed |
| Wound Minor (contained drainage) | | Routine Practices | If invasive group A streptococcal infection suspected: Droplet/Contact Precautions for first 24 hours of antimicrobial therapy | Any |
| Wound Major (uncontained drainage) | | Contact Precautions Precautions Droplet Precautions Airborne Precautions for AGMPs until am/pm ondate | Contact Precautions or if invasive group A streptococcal infection suspected: Droplet/Contact Precautions for the first 24 hours of antimicrobial therapy | Single Room |

^{*} AllR: Airborne Infection Isolation Room

Persons with syndromes or conditions listed may present with atypical signs or symptoms (e.g., neonates and adults with pertussis may not have paroxysmal or severe cough). The index of suspicion should be guided by prevalence of specific conditions in the community and clinical judgement.
