Winnipeg Fire Paramedic Services

To protect yourself and your family in the event of a fire, properly installed and maintained smoke alarms will provide an early warning alarm to your household.

- The S.A.F.E Family (Smoke Alarm For Every Family) supplies and installs a smoke alarm in owner-occupied households not equipped with a working smoke alarm. If you do not have the resources to supply and install a own smoke alarm for any reason you can apply to have one provided by the program by calling 311 or using the contact form at https://winnipeg.ca/fps/CommunityRelations/SafeFamily.stm. Note: this service has been temporarily suspended due to COVID-19.
- S.A.F.E. Family Program is not available to rented homes and apartments. If you live in a rental property and you do not have a working smoke alarm talk to landlord first. If it isn't resolved, you can <u>Fill out a form</u> and a Fire Inspector will contact you and resolve the issue with the property owner.

Garbage and Recycling

If you are unable to take your garbage and recycling to the curb or lane and have no one to help you, you can apply to the City of Winnipeg for a "Walk up Service". City collectors will take your carts from your property to the truck, and return them. You need to apply for this service and have the application signed by a health care professional. You must re-apply each year, however, a medical signature is not needed.

Age & Opportunity (A & O): Support Services for Older Adults – Safety Aid Program

SafetyAid is falls prevention program for seniors 65 years of age and older. The program provides risk audits and education for all and, for low income people, provides non-slip bath mats, nightlights, flashlights, fluorescent stair tape, ice melt for sidewalks and ice grip tips for canes.

Community Home Services Program (CHSP)

The CHSP provides free community services such as light house cleaning, yard work, snow removal and occasional heavy duty cleaning to low income seniors (60+) and persons with a disability who have home care in place living independently within Winnipeg. Applicants for CHSP services must meet eligibility criteria.

Good Neighbours Active Living Centre - Home Maintenance Program for Seniors

The Home Maintenance Program helps you find someone in your community who can do various jobs such as housekeeping, meal preparation, painting, carpentry, yard work, minor plumbing and minor electrical, at reasonable rates. All service providers are screened with a criminal reference check, interview and references to ensure your safety. To be eligible for the program you must be 55 years of age or older; able to make arrangements with service providers; and living within Winnipeg.
