

## **URIS Program Monitoring Report for the 2014-2015 School Year**

The Winnipeg Regional Health Authority provides service to community program staff including schools, licensed child care facilities, agencies that provide respite and recreational programs within Winnipeg. Services include the annual development of health care plans and training of community program staff for children with specific health care needs.

### **Health Care Plans**

Individual Health Care Plans (IHCPs) are completed for children that require a child specific response to emergencies and/or daily interventions (e.g., bleeding disorders, cardiac conditions, diabetes, seizure disorders, gastrostomy care, ostomy care, catheterization, osteogenesis imperfecta, steroid dependent conditions, oxygen and suctioning).

- In 2014/15, 98% of IHCPs were completed or reviewed. The goal is 100%.

Standard Health Care Plans (SHCPs) are completed for students with asthma and/or anaphylaxis. For students with asthma that are independent, an Emergency Response Plan (ERP) is provided to the school.

- In 2014/15, 90% of SHCP/ERPs were completed or reviewed annually. The goal is 85%.

### **Training**

Group training is provided to all staff for health care needs that require a response to emergency situations (e.g., anaphylaxis, asthma, bleeding disorders, cardiac conditions, diabetes, seizure disorders, steroid dependent conditions, osteogenesis imperfecta).

- In 2014/15, 95% of community programs received training for health care needs that require a response to emergency situations. The goal is 100%.

Child specific training is provided to designated staff for students that require daily interventions (e.g., gastrostomy care, ostomy care, catheterization, oxygen, suctioning, blood glucose monitoring for diabetes, administration of midazolam for seizure disorders).

- In 2014/15, 98% of children that require child specific training had at least one designated staff trained on an annual basis. The goal is 100%.
