As a result of discussing the youth health survey with the principal, the school engaged PHN for topics not directly related to survey content as follows. Nutrition education for parents, Child health and school readiness- phn met parents during "meet the teacher" days to review child immunizations, speech and hearing (kindergartens) other needed community resources ie: doctor, dentist, housing. Kindergarten immunization clinic done is September.

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Point Douglas, <i>continued</i>							PHN now attending parent council meetings where staff and parents ask for support such as Lice teaching with staff and calling parents who are experiencing reoccurring infections. Parent council invites phn to work with health teacher to deliver teaching of sensitive topics ie: reproductive health, addictions by way of collaborating with the teacher to share information. School asking for help with home safety/responsible babysitters info- many children babysitting younger siblings and children are injured or sick often. School asking for help with proposals in order to improve the safety of the playground and add green space (trees/shrubs, benches).
