







The old normal...


Some changes



- 1. More people are using drugs (all routes)
- 2. More people are injecting drugs
- 3. People who inject are injecting more frequently
- 4. The change to van staffing is a factor
- 5. More needles are leaving town



Of 49 survey respondents in September 2016:



Don't forget...

It could just be that people are using more SAFELY (i.e., we're meeting the demand better than before).

If no rise in HCV/HIV among people who use drugs, what we have is:

- ✓ a budget problem, plus
- ✓ something happening re: use, but not
- ✓ an STBBI problem necessarily.



Conclusions

- There doesn't appear to be an increase in the number of people using drugs.
- People who once were smoking drugs are now injecting them (e.g., getting 20 needles at a time instead of 2 safer crack use kits).



Conclusions

Drug-use is likely happening more safely, both for previous users of injection drugs and for former smokers. (But need to watch the epi of HCV and HIV closely.)

 We've been able to accommodate this shift because of our increased ability to serve home visits.

Some proportion of needles is leaving town.
