Renal



Open to all eligible nurses (prefer minimum one year acute care experience) who complete the MNNC self-learning package and have secured a position within MRP

The Manitoba Nephrology Nurse Course (MNNC) provides training for nephrology nurses in Manitoba and prepares nurses to deliver comprehensive nursing care to renal patients



Offered approximately six times throughout the year

Perioperative



Open to all eligible registered nurses who secure a perioperative position within the WRHA/Shared Health



12-week training didactic program

AORN Periop 101: A Core Curriculum and 40 hours of dedicated education time to complete online modules

Periop 101: Designed to provide registered nurses, who have no previous experience, with the basic knowledge and clinical skills necessary to function independently in an entry-level perioperative nursing position.

PACU



Open to all eligible registered nurses (prefer minimum one-year acute care experience) who secure a position within HSC Winnipeg PACU



12-week training program

Online Essentials Critical Care Orientation Program (ECCO):
The combined computer core theory, laboratory practice and clinical specialty components offer a robust entry to PACU nursing.



Offered as staff hired

Emergency



Open to all eligible registered nurses (acute care experience, or new grads who have completed their senior practicum in ED/UC, preferred).



Four levels of emergency program education with classroom and on-site clinical skill development shifts

Level 1A: Introduction to Emergency Department - care of lower-to-mid acuity patients; includes Trauma Nursing Core Course (TNCC) certification (6 days)

Level 1B: Care of acute patients in the ED; Instruction with focus on monitoring skills (4 days)

Resuscitation: Instruction and simulation with Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) certification (5 days)

Triage: National Canadian Triage Acuity Scale (CTAS) Curriculum (3 days)

Clinical skill development shifts are based on individual experience and learning requirements



Nurses receive full salary during classroom and on-site clinical skill development shifts.



The WRHA Emergency Program orientation is designed to enable the nurse learner to further develop their critical thinking skills, assessment skills and application of the nursing process to patients in the ED/UC environment, progressively building on the competency and skills developed over a period of 12-24 months.



All levels are offered several times throughout the year.

Cardiac Critical Care ACCU and ICCS



Open to all eligible nurses with minimum one year acute care nursing experience who secure a Critical Care Trainee position

ACCU cares for medically complex and critically ill cardiology patients. ICCS cares for critically ill cardiac surgery patients.

The Advanced Assessment Course (AA) provides enhanced training for cardiac nurses. Prepares nurses to deliver comprehensive nursing care to cardiology (ACS, congenital, HF, transplant) and cardiac surgery inpatients (VAD, epicardial wires, amiodarone infusions, cardioversion).

Cardiac Sciences

Y2 Cardiac Specialty Care (Y2)



Open to all eligible registered nurses with a minimum two years of recent nursing experience in Cardiology / Cardiac Surgery or Emergency



12-week training program



Financial support: Salary relief duration of program



Online Essentials Critical Care Orientation Program (ECCO): The combined computer core theory, laboratory practice and clinical specialty components offer a robust entry to Cardiac Specialty Care nursing including, care of patients pre and post cardiac catheterization and interventional procedures and assisting with pacemaker insertions, electrophysiology procedures, cardioversions, and transesophageal and stress echo.



Offered as staff are hired

Adult Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory



Open to all eligible registered nurses with a minimum two years of recent ICU or ER experience



Progressive training over several months prepares nurses to assist the Interventional Cardiologist with various cardiac diagnostic and interventional procedures including: coronary angiograms; PTCA/CAS; RHC/LHC, shunt calculations and aortic and mitral valve areas; rotoblation, intraaortic balloon pump insertion, TAVI, use of intravascular ultrasound, and temporary pacemaker implantation.
