## **Introducing Primary Care Connectors**

Enhancing primary care is central to achieving the long-term vision of high-quality continuous, coordinated care for all Manitobans. Ensuring that all Manitobans have access to a physician or nurse practitioner who will provide them with ongoing primary care is a first step in achieving this vision.

Manitoba Health is working with the various professional colleges and associations, and a number of individual physicians and nurse practitioners in Manitoba to help identify ways to better connect Manitobans to primary care. A key part of this strategy includes enhancements to the Family Doctor Connection Program that will be fully operational by September 2013.

## **Primary Care Connectors**

- As part of the enhancements to the Family Doctor Connection Program, Primary Care Connectors are now being recruited and oriented in each region.
- Primary Care Connectors will be a central point of contact to help connect primary care
  practitioners to regional and provincial resources and will provide a bridge to unattached
  patients without inundating clinics with requests.
- Their main priority is to get to know the primary care practices in their region and what supports would help them to accept new patients.
